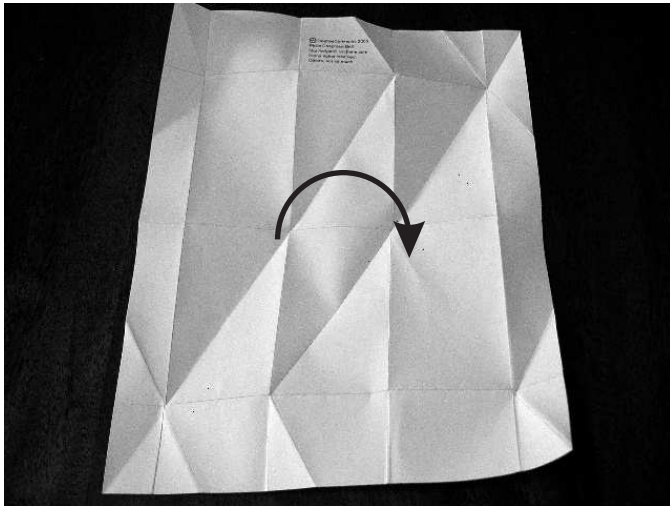
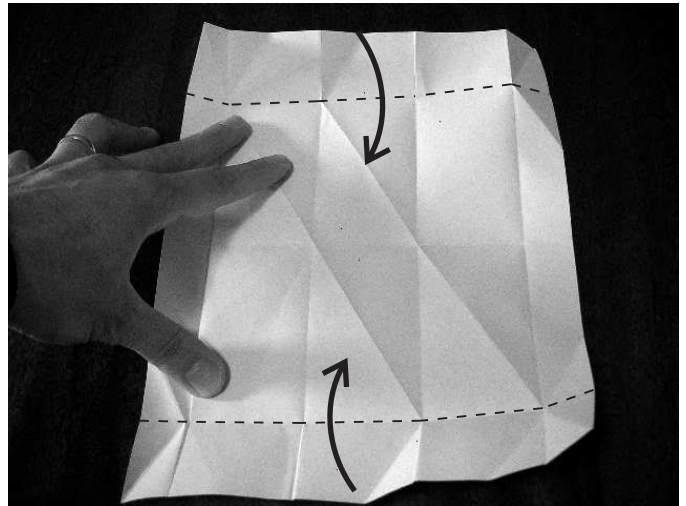


Three Card Monte Sequenced CP



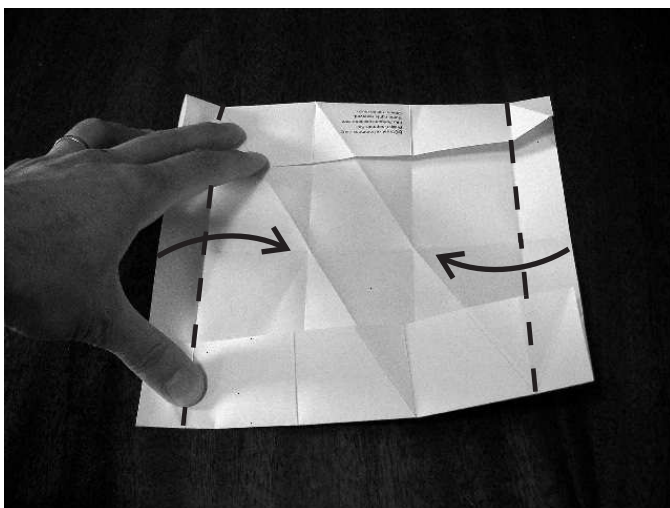
This is the CP printed out and creased. The blue lines are mountain folds and the red lines are valley folds.

Flip the paper over.



Fold in the top and bottom edges.

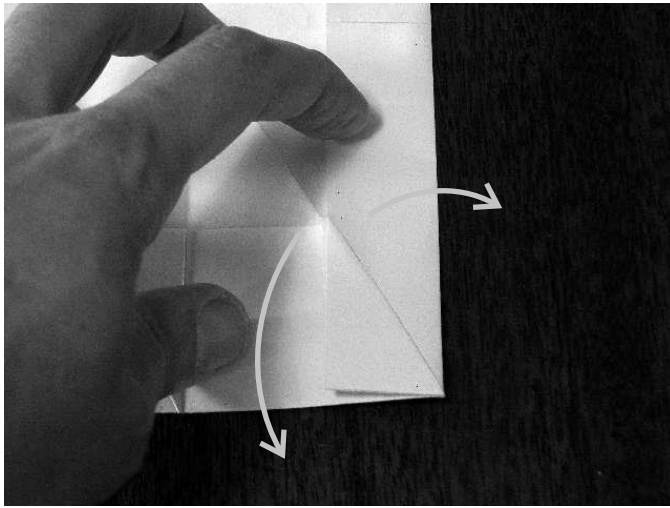

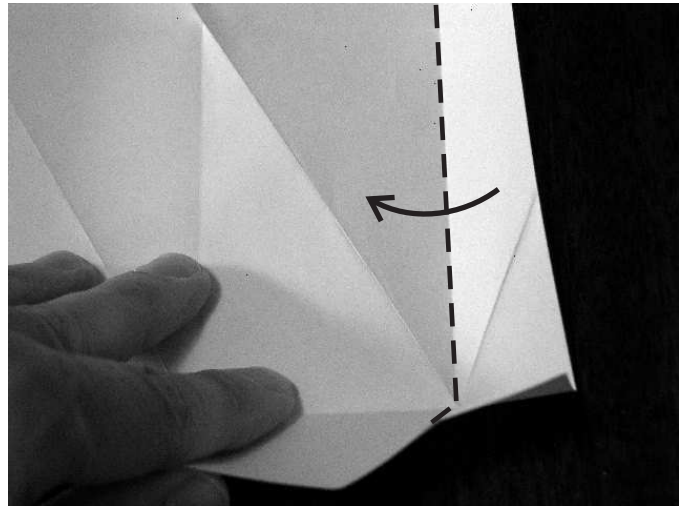
Fold the sides in.

On the bottom right-hand corner, open the flaps back out.



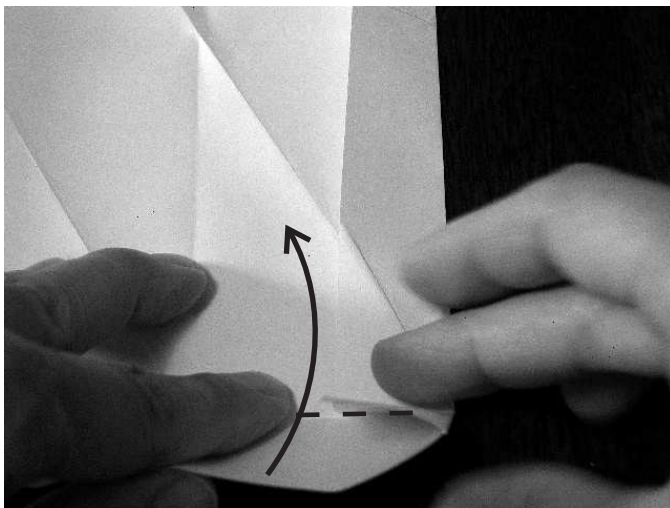
Fold the side flap back in.

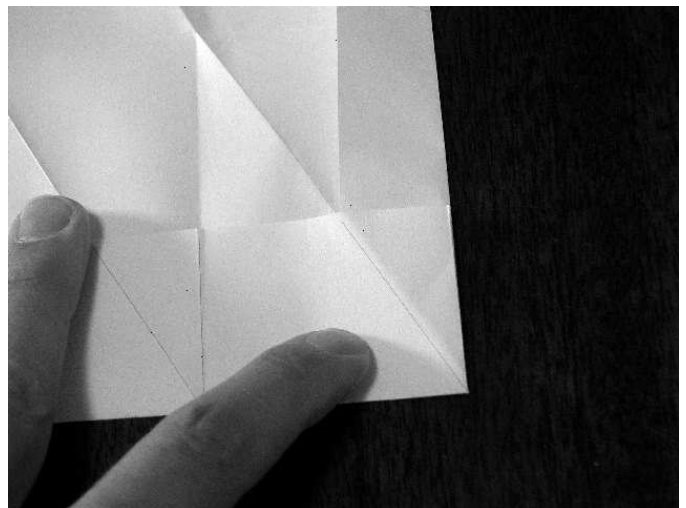

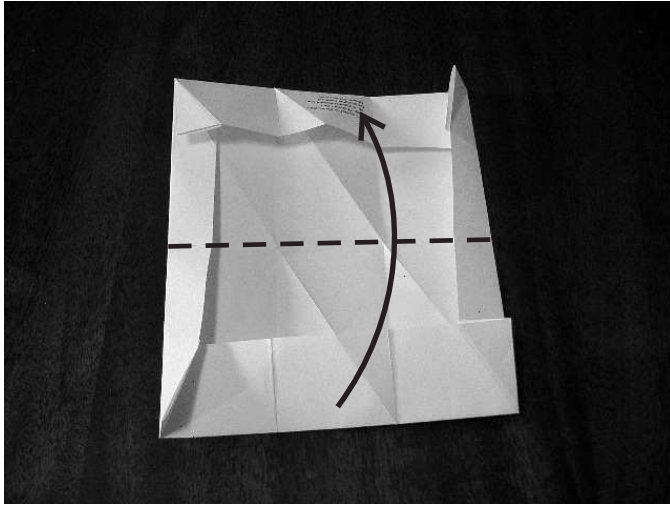


Fold the bottom back in.



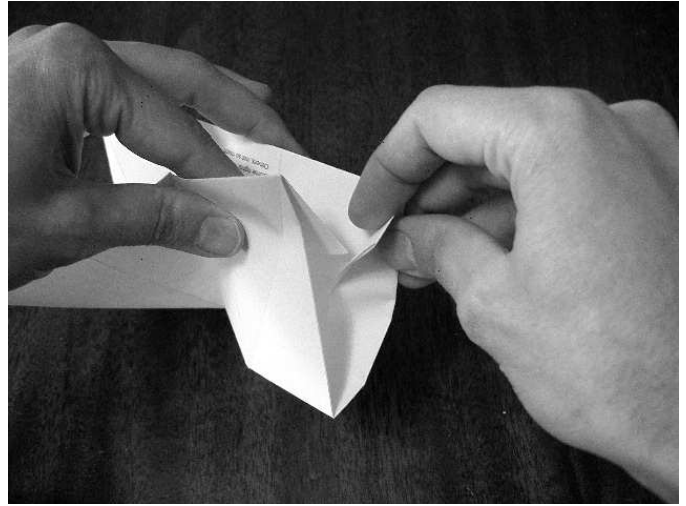
Thus.

Repeat steps 5-7 on the upper left-hand corner, taking care that the upper right-hand and lower left-hand corners are not changed.



Note the corner orientation. These represent flaps and pockets.

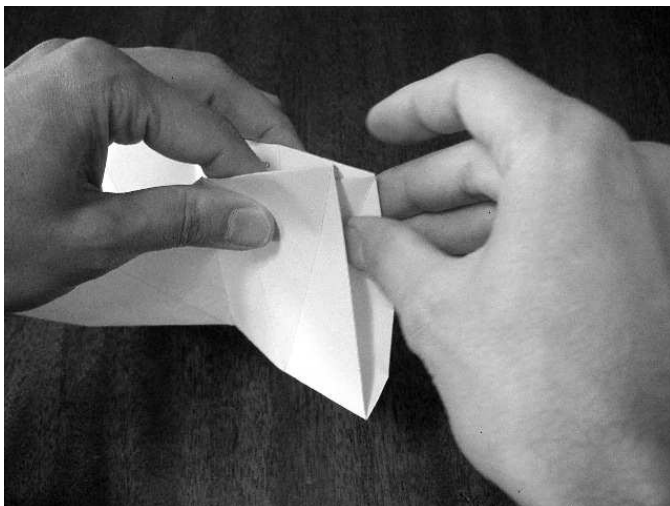
Fold the bottom up to meet the top.



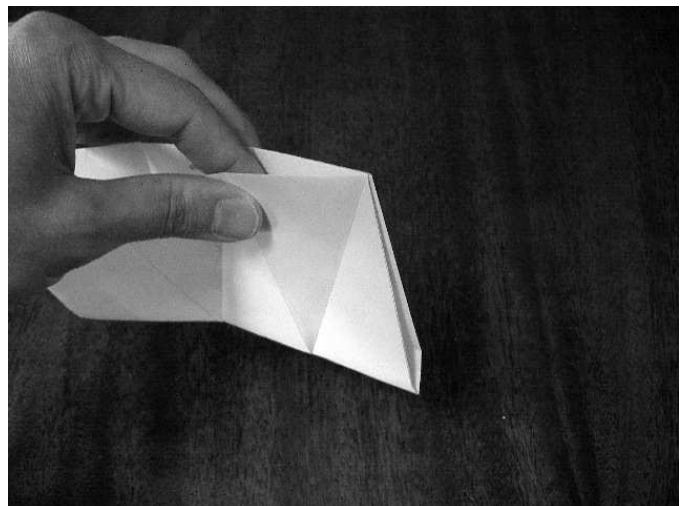
Tuck the flap in back into the pocket in the front.

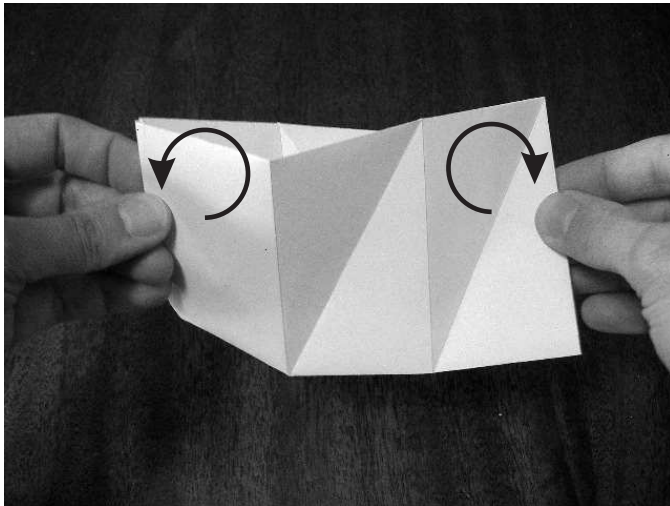


Thus.

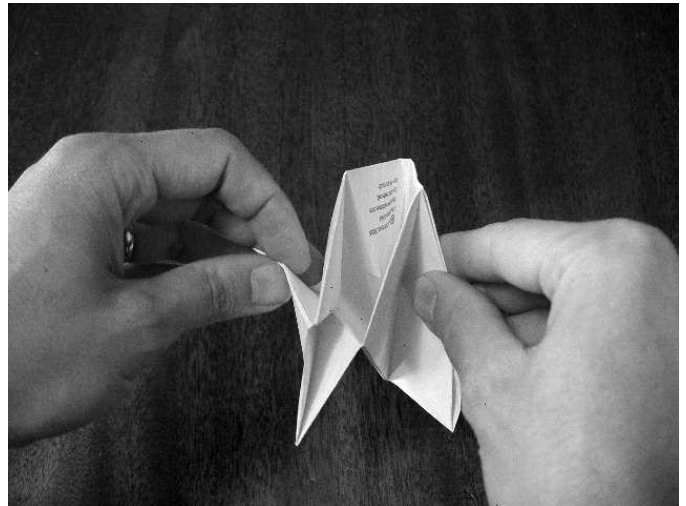


Completely tucked.

Repeat steps 10 and 11 on the left side. This will make a wallet shape.



Gently twist: clockwise on the right side, counterclockwise on the left side.



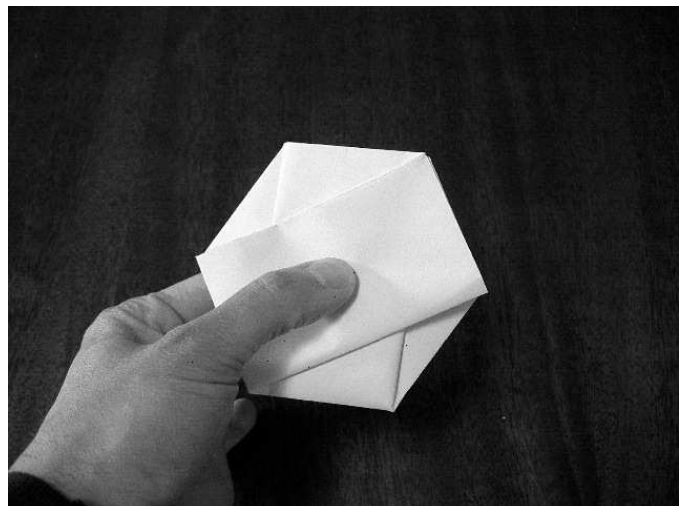
Twist until the model flattens out.
